2. When we arrived in the house, there was no boundary wall. We built the terrace after building the boundary wall and paved the terrace in 2011, making a clean area for the children to play.

4. 4 and 5 – the office currently serves as a store as well as an office. The front entrance is used for small group play in the mornings, in this picture the new children have gathered together to listen to Alex play his penny whistle. The jewellery makers gather there each afternoon.



5. 6 and 7 - Nursery 1a and Nursery 2b





8. The volunteer accommodation has been furnished entirely by accommodation charges received from volunteers and visitors. We have three bedrooms and a bathroom and in September we were able to organise our kitchen so that we have a place to sit and eat and facilities for cooking.

11 to 14 – the craft room is where some of the women do the sewing.



Extensive alterations were made to the buildings behind the main house. There were originally three dwellings here. Walls were removed and new partitions built. Everywhere was re-wired and painted to provide the accommodation we have here now, maximizing the use of the available space.

15 and 18 Nursery 2a and Nursery 1b



Possibly our biggest challenge has been to organise the area behind the buildings – building a retaining wall, the toilets for the children and we are now preparing to build the last classroom space we can accommodate.





And finally our playing field, given to us by the Commissioner General of Police. The children love this big open space and it is used by the community at every available opportunity.
